

STOURBRIDGE GLASS QUARTER

THE CRYSTAL MILE

The days of mass, hand-cut crystal production in Stourbridge may be gone, but an exciting new era of glass making based on 400 years of traditions and history in the Black Country has begun. New skills and developments are emerging along the Crystal Mile that meet the needs of modern day markets.

Tourism is a major market for the Glass Quarter. Many of the old glass factory buildings that manufactured top brands of hand-cut crystal such as Stuart, Webb Corbett and Royal Doulton now present a look back in time. These buildings have become some of the Black Country's leading visitor attractions, offering demonstrations of contemporary glassmaking.

The magnificent Red House Glass Cone is one of only a few remaining in the UK and Broadfield House Glass Museum houses possibly the largest collection of glass in Britain. The Webb Corbett Visitor Centre is home to the finds of two recent archaeological on-site digs, presenting visitors with a time capsule of several centuries of glass production.

Many attractions offer workshops to artisan craftspeople who produce their work on site and sell to the public, offering visitors a unique opportunity to purchase gifts that have been made locally.

All the attractions along the Crystal Mile offer their facilities free but some charge for group bookings to cover guided tour costs. Catering is available at several sites and the Glass Quarter now offers group packages that link all attractions.

RED HOUSE GLASS CONE

The cone will once again host the Guild of Glass Engravers Exhibition **International Contemporary Engraved Glass** from 18th May – 26th June. It will include a variety of glass and different styles of engraving and engraved subjects.

Within the Guild's exhibition will be **Gravur on Tour: Modern European Glass Engraving** – a small, touring show of 31 pieces of art glass representing the diversity of contemporary glass engraving, including experimental and traditional work.

Singer, composer and visual artist Andi Garbi will showcase a sound heritage project exhibition **Shadows and Dust**, which was originally made for the Coffin Works Museum in Birmingham. Andi will draw inspiration from the unique acoustics within the Cone to compose a piece of original music.

On the 30th and 31st of May, the Cone will step back in time to look at different periods in glassmaking history with a series of demonstrations from **The Bandits of Glass**,



including techniques from Ancient, Roman, Renaissance, Italian Murano, the 19th century, Glass Nuvo and contemporary glass. All pieces will be auctioned for the British

Glass Foundation. The historical re-enactment society The Guild of the Blessed St. Edmund will set up camp on site showing aspects of medieval life and knights in armour.

Red House Glass Cone will be open 10.00am-5.00pm Thursday 28th-Sunday 31st May, with glassmaking demonstrations, open crafts studios and the Red Cone Coffee House on site.

BROADFIELD HOUSE GLASS MUSEUM

Broadfield House Glass Museum will offer an impressive variety of experiences for visitors during Festival Week. There will be demonstrations, hands-on experiences and history, beginning with Ladies Day on 25th

May and finishing with Paperweights on the 31st. There will be glassmaking demonstrations



by artists including Allister Malcolm, Tim Boswell, Elliott Walker, Lynn Baker, Jonathan Harris, Vic Bamforth and Darren Weed and engraving demonstrations by Nancy Sutcliffe and Steve Piper. There will be an exhibition of Cutting Edge contemporary glass from Hungary, a flint knapper will demonstrate his skills with old bottles, archaeologists will conduct excavations on 31st May, a host of rare designs and manuscripts will be on show from the archives and a Family Fun Day will take place on 30th May with donkey rides and a fire engine.

WEBB CORBETT VISITOR CENTRE

Webb Corbett was a renowned brand within the British and Worldwide hand-cut crystal market. In 1912, the company moved to this site and was taken over by Royal Doulton in 1969.

Production continued until its closure in 1999, when the site was converted into Glasshouse College which is a working college for students with special educational needs.

Thanks to new technology and artefacts, the basement of the Bottom Glassworks known as the 'caves' tells the story of 100 years of glass production, including the manufacturing of crystal and the heritage and social history that existed within the factory and the glass making

quarter. Some of the volunteer staff spent their working life within the crystal industry.

The finds of two archaeological digs that took place in 2014 are now on show. The remnants of two 1690s glass cones were excavated, providing a time capsule of British glass making artefacts spanning over 300 years of glassmaking on the site.
